While required rotations offer a solid foundation in Ambulatory Care, the program also offers opportunities for growth in multiple specialties areas based on resident interest.

The Residency Program

Our PGY2 pharmacy residency program builds on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions. Upon completing our program, residents will:

- Be eligible for board certification
- Gain experience precepting APPE students
- Demonstrate the advanced clinical skills necessary to provide direct patient care for various ambulatory populations

Program Requirements

- Complete or facilitate an accredited teaching and learning certificate program
- Complete one IRB-approved research project
- Present a 1-hour ACPE-approved CE
- Present at regional and national pharmacy conferences

Qualifications

- Completion of an ASHP-accredited PGY1 residency
- Eligible to attain licensure in the state of Connecticut by September 30 of the residency program year
