OPENING REMARKS:

Pastor Kristopher Reese MASTER OF CEREMONIES



Pastor Kristopher Reese has served as Senior Pastor of Grace Baptist Church since 2015, leading impactful ministries that uplift the Waterbury community. He partners with local businesses to support families in need and organizes annual initiatives like the Adopt-A-Family Christmas Drive and free weekend meals for seniors. Under his leadership, Grace Baptist Church has adopted Brass City Charter School and Walsh Elementary School, offering student recognition programs and teacher appreciation events. He also provides resume and interview workshops and hosts career fairs. Pastor Reese serves on numerous boards, including the Interfaith Action Fellowship

and Waterbury's Diversity Committee. He holds multiple degrees, including an honorary Doctorate in Strategic Leadership, and in 2025, was named one of Connecticut's 100 Men of Color.

Mayor Paul K. Pernerewski, Jr. City of Waterbury



Mayor Paul Pernerewski, Jr. was born and raised in Waterbury, where he and his wife Kim continue to live and raise their three sons. A graduate of Holy Cross High School, UConn, and Georgetown Law, the Mayor practiced law for 37 years, including roles as

Assistant Attorney General for the State of Connecticut and General Counsel for the Connecticut Airport Authority. He also taught Business Law at Naugatuck Valley Community College. Serving the community has always been a priority for him. In 2001 he felt passionate that his law background would help Waterbury overcome mismanagement, fiscal irresponsibility, and corruption. Appointed to the Board of Aldermen in 2001, he became President in 2009 and was elected Mayor of Waterbury in 2023. Mayor Pernerewski led efforts to improve Waterbury's bond rating and city management. As Mayor, he focuses on economic growth, education, and public safety. His collaborative leadership reflects his lifelong commitment to community and integrity.

Congresswoman Jahana Hayes



Congresswoman Jahana Hayes represents Connecticut's 5th District in the United States House of Representatives. The district spans northwest and central Connecticut, including her hometown of Waterbury. Elected in 2018, she is the first

African-American woman to ever represent Connecticut in Congress. Congresswoman Hayes serves on the House Committees on Education and Workforce, and Agriculture, where she is Ranking Member of the Subcommittee on Nutrition and Foreign Agriculture. Her legislative focus includes equitable access to quality education, health care, labor, agriculture and veterans. During her Congressional tenure, the Congresswoman has had 11 bills signed into law. To date she has introduced 80 bills and cosponsored over 2,100 pieces of legislation across a broad range topics. Hayes holds degrees from Naugatuck Valley Community College, Southern Connecticut State University, University of Saint Joseph, and University of Bridgeport.

Jacquelyn D. Jordan, PhD, MSN, BSN, RN



Dr. Jacquelyn Jordan is a Waterbury native and Vietnam-era Army veteran. She rose from public housing to become a leader in nursing education. Her doctoral research examined how racial identity affects Black nursing students in majority institutions, a

topic she's presented nationwide. She holds degrees from Adelphi University, Yale University, Western Connecticut State University (WCSU), and MCC, and completed leadership education at Wellesley College. Dr. Jordan served as Dean at Howard and Towson Universities, and launched Westfield State University's first nursing program. She's taught at WCSU, MCC, and Yale University, and held clinical and leadership roles at several Connecticut hospitals. Now an independent consultant, she's received numerous honors for academic and community service. Dr. Jordan continues to mentor emerging nurse leaders and advocates for equity in health care education.

Karana M. Pierre, DPM



Dr. Karana Pierre is a podiatrist with 23 years of experience, originally from Loreauville, Louisiana. She earned her bachelor's degree from Xavier University and her Doctorate in Podiatric Medicine from New York College of Podiatric Medicine. After residency

at Wyckoff Heights Medical Center, she relocated to Connecticut, serving as Podiatrist/Clinical Coordinator and Infection Control Chair at Optimus Healthcare for 13 years. Dr. Kwame Asante is Chairman of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Director of Mount Sinai Rehabilitation Hospital. Previously, he served as Chief of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at New England Baptist Hospital in

Boston. Board-certified, Dr. Asante earned his medical degree with honors from Meharry Medical College and was inducted into Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society. He completed an internal medicine internship at the University of Chicago, dermatology training at Penn State Hershey, and a Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation residency at Temple University/Moss Rehabilitation Hospital, where he served as chief resident. Dr Asante has been recognized by CT Magazine as a Top Doctor in Connecticut for 2024 and 2025. He currently serves as the President of the Board of Directors of Brain Injury Alliance of Connecticut.

Dr. Laurencin then completed an adult reconstruction fellowship through Harvard University, with appointment as an assistant in orthopedic surgery at Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH). The Harvard-MGH adult reconstruction fellowship is the oldest continuous arthroplasty training program in the United States.
